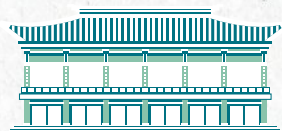

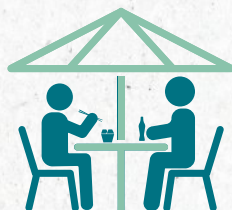


Hiking Course

City of Franchises, Daegu

While franchises typically begin in Seoul and spread nationwide, many gain popularity in local cities and then expand across the country. Among them, Daegu is the birthplace of 2 out of Korea's top 10 mega brands, and has the highest number of franchise headquarters outside the capital region.



The most notable sector in Daegu's franchise scene is 'chicken.' The two Daegu-born mega brands, 'Kyochon' and 'Mexicana,' are both in the chicken industry. Local pioneers such as 'Hosigi Double Chicken' and 'Ttang Ttang Chicken' also originated in Daegu. The 'Twozzim' brand, known for jjimdak (braised chicken), also calls Daegu home. Additionally, dishes made with chicken feet, gizzards, and chicken intestines are diverse and unique.

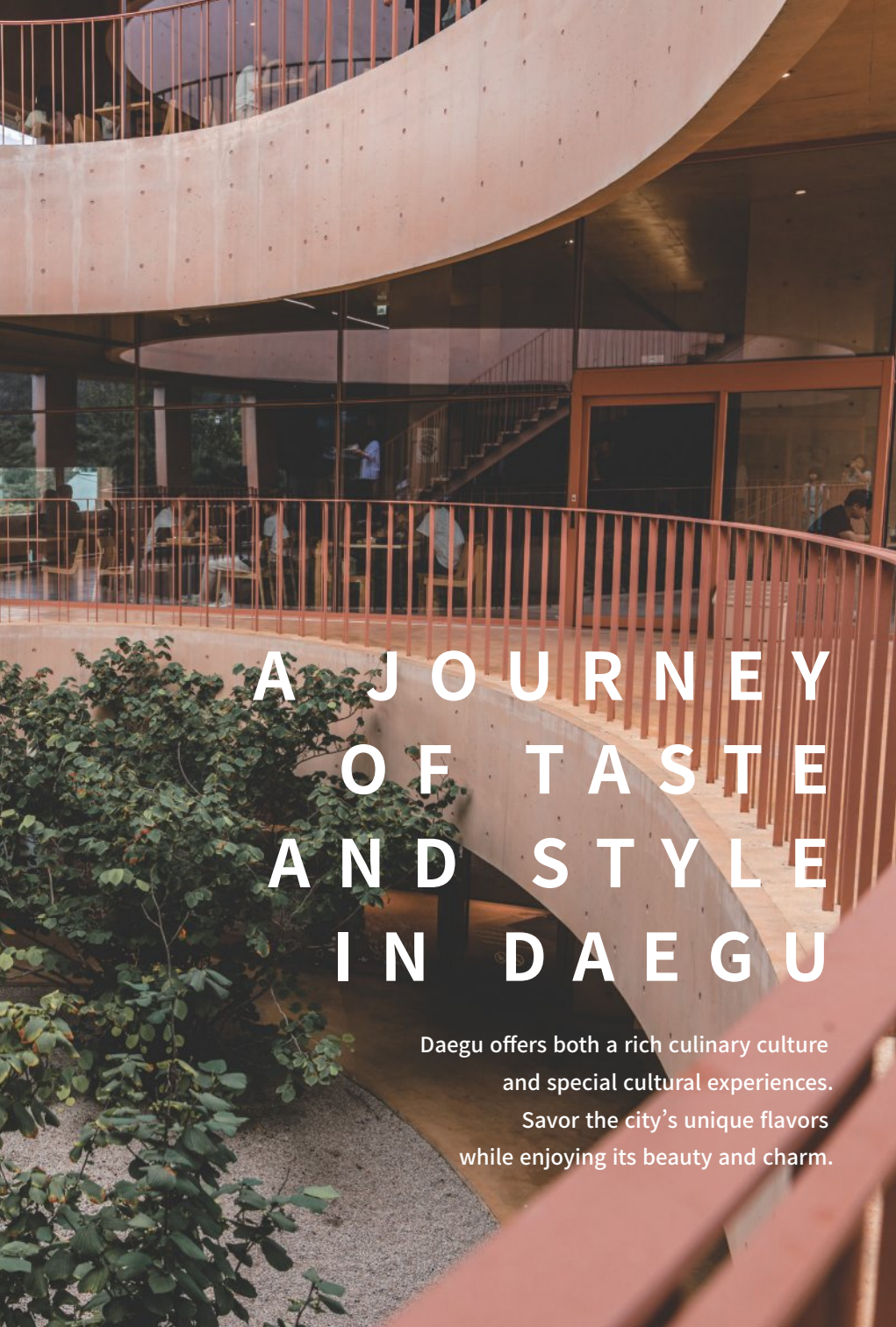
Another representative dish, grilled pork intestines (makchang), is a Daegu specialty that gained national popularity through local brands like 'Daegu Banyawool Makchang' and 'Makchang Doduk,' which remained popular even during the COVID-19 period. Daegu's bakery scene is also noteworthy. So much so that people visit Daegu for a 'bakery tour.' Leading the way are 'Samsong Bakery,' 'Geundae Golmok Red Bean Bread,' and 'Ppangjangsu Red Bean Bread.' 'Shinjeon Tteokbokki,' known for its fried fishcake as much as tteokbokki, also started in Daegu.

Other notable brands include 'Tokkijeong,' a Japanese home-style restaurant found in department stores and shopping malls nationwide; 'Seoga & Cook,' which began as a small restaurant in Dongseong-ro; and 'Hyeonpung Chicken Kalguksu,' known for its chicken and knife-cut noodles, headquartered in Hyeonpung-eup, Dalseong-gun. With its abundance of unique food, Daegu is a perfect destination for gourmet travel. Visiting the headquarters of familiar brands can also be a fun and meaningful journey.

Daegu's Ten Flavors That Captivate Global Tastes



1 | Daegu Yukgaejang
(Ttarogukbap)

Daegu is renowned as the city of Yukgaejang (spicy beef soup), offering some of the spiciest and most diverse beef soups in Korea. A distinctive feature is its serving style; unlike typical gukbap dishes, it is served as 'Ttarogukbap,' with rice and soup served separately. Instead of just chili powder, a special chili oil made by mixing chili powder with melted beef fat is used in the seasoning. The capsaicin provides a sweating effect in hot summers and warming comfort in cold winters. This fiery and bold taste was born from Daegu's 'extreme seasonal' temperatures.

Boneless blowfish is mixed with bean sprouts and spicy seasoning, then grilled. Paired with vegetables and a drink, it's often followed by stir-fried rice or added ramen noodles using the leftover sauce. The texture is chewy and lean, starting with a spicy kick and ending with a hint of sweetness.

(Fresh Raw Beef)

Daegu is the original home of 'Mungtigi,' made with thick cuts of raw Korean beef. Unlike regular yukhoe (thinly sliced seasoned raw beef), Mungtigi features thick, thumb-sized chunks of unseasoned beef cut from the inner thigh. It's dipped in a sauce made from sesame oil, garlic, and chili powder, highlighting the freshness of the beef and the umami of the dipping sauce.

Jingolmok

Meaning 'long alley,' Jingolmok is a narrow alleyway nestled within a bustling downtown of shopping centers and department stores, offering a glimpse of old culture and atmosphere. Today, it's also famous as a food street.

Makchang



The culture of eating makchang, developed in Daegu, has now spread across Korea. Beef makchang comes from the fourth stomach (hongchang), while pork makchang is from the end section of the intestine. Grilled over charcoal or briquettes and served with a special soybean paste sauce, garlic, and scallions, it's a protein-rich delicacy with a chewy texture and savory flavor, making it a perfect pairing with soju. Try the original grilled makchang at Daegu's makchang alley for its rich, chewy taste.

Anjirang Gopchang Alley

From Anjirang Intersection to Anjirang Market, gopchang restaurants line the streets. Known for affordable prices, chewy texture, and spicy seasoning, each restaurant offers unique secret sauces—from fiery fire gopchang to cheese gopchang inspired by Western fondue.

Jungni-dong Gopchang Alley

Previously a slaughterhouse area, it earned fame for fresh and affordable ingredients, becoming a mecca for beef tail dishes. Specializing in beef large intestines and gopchang, the main dish here is a hot pot with broth poured directly over the meat.

Bokhyeon Five-Way Food Alley

In the late 1990s, when makchang started booming, restaurants clustered around Bokhyeon Five-Way Intersection in Buk-gu. Today, the area is packed with eateries serving not only makchang but also chicken and seafood.

As a landlocked city, Daegu once lacked access to live fish, leading to the creation of a local delicacy: Muchimhoe. Ingredients such as squid, conch, and freshwater snails are lightly boiled and mixed with shredded radish, water celery, chili powder, garlic, and ginger. The result is a dish that's simultaneously spicy, sweet, and tangy. It pairs excellently with the accompanying freshwater clam soup.

Banggogae Muchimhoe Alley

In the early 1960s, 'Jinju Restaurant' in Banggogae began serving Muchimhoe. Gradually, more restaurants opened, forming today's Muchimhoe Alley.

6 | **Nureun Guksu**
(Pressed Noodles)

Daegu is famous for its exceptional love for noodles, with the highest noodle consumption in the country. Known locally as Gyeongsang-do Kalguksu, this dish uses a rich anchovy-based broth instead of the typical beef bone or seafood stock. The noodles are made with a mix of wheat and soybean flour, cut wide and thin, and boiled in deeply brewed anchovy broth, offering a distinctive flavor profile.

Seomun Market

In the alley behind Seonam Building, noodle stalls line the streets. Between Zones 1 and 4, over 20 stalls serve this local specialty, forming the famous Noodle Alley. No matter the season, the area is always crowded, proving Daegu residents' passionate love for noodles.

A stir-fried udon dish created in Daegu known for its spicy and savory flavor. Seasoned with chili powder and garlic, it features vegetables like onion, cabbage, zucchini, bean sprouts, wood ear mushrooms, and proteins such as squid and pork. Stir-fried quickly over high heat without broth, it retains all the aroma and taste of its ingredients. It's a flavorful, addictive noodle dish.

7 | **Yaki Udon**



8 | **Napjak Mandu**
(Flat Dumplings)

A creative dumpling unique to Daegu, made with vegetable filling to reduce the greasy taste of traditional dumplings. Stuffed with small amounts of glass noodles, chives, carrots, cabbage, and green onion, the half-moon-shaped dumplings are flattened, boiled once, then fried. They are served topped with chopped green onions, chili powder, and soy sauce. Nowadays, they are also enjoyed with spicy rice cakes or seasoned vegetables for a flavorful twist. They pair well with spicy raw seafood salad (Muchimhoe).



9 | **Spicy Catfish Stew**
(Nonmegi Maeuntang)

This dish features live catfish raised in rice paddies, simmered in a broth made with kelp and radish, then seasoned generously with garlic and chili powder. This new style of Maeuntang in Daegu is known for its lack of fishy smell, bold spicy flavor, and generous portions at affordable prices. Adding hand-torn dough flakes (sujebi) brings out even more richness in the broth.

Nonmegi Maeuntang Village

Bugok-ri in Dasa-eup, Dalseong-gun, is known as the sacred place of Nonmegi Maeuntang. Originally a quiet rural village, it sought new sources of income through rice-paddy catfish farming. As Maeuntang restaurants opened, the area became a hotspot for food lovers. Around 20 Nonmegi Maeuntang restaurants are thriving near Munyang Station (Line 2).

A unique Daegu-style dish where beef short ribs are simmered in a dented aluminum pot with spicy chili powder and minced garlic. Unlike the soy sauce-based jjimgalbi of other regions, this version is fiery yet slightly sweet, leaving a tingling sensation on the tongue. It's excellent as a side dish with alcohol and even better when mixed with rice in the leftover sauce.

Dongin-dong Jjimgalbi Alley

This alley in Dongin-dong, Jung-gu, is home to many jjimgalbi specialty restaurants. Since the Daegu Summer Universiade, it has attracted not only domestic but also international tourists, becoming one of the city's most popular food alleys.

Traditional night markets that open after dark are full of sights, tastes, and entertainment, offering special memories and attractions that outshine the daytime.

Once one of Korea's top three markets during the Joseon Dynasty, Seomun Market still maintains its grand scale. The Seomun Night Market brightens up weekend nights with over 350 meters of food trucks, making it the largest night market in Korea. As the 80+ food trucks start preparing, crowds quickly gather. In addition to food, there are dance club performances, flea markets, and more. When Seomun Night Market lights up, the energy of Daegu truly comes alive.

Chilseong Market began with farmers selling produce on the Sincheon Riverbank. Now it has grown into a massive market with furniture, used electronics, and tools. As one of Daegu's two major night markets alongside Seomun, Chilseong Night Market offers both traditional favorites and creative new street foods. With Sincheon flowing nearby and a scenic night view, plus a comfortable 400-seat rest area, it's a popular downtown retreat.

Dongseong-ro

Dongseong-ro is bustling with people 365 days a year. At night, it becomes even livelier, full of youth and romance, giving you a true sense of Daegu.



The Ferris wheel at Spark Land, a shopping mall and theme park, is a popular photo spot. Some cabins are even equipped with karaoke machines.



Dongseong-ro

Dongseong-ro was created by removing the eastern wall of the old Daegu fortress, forming a 0.92km street. Convenient transportation, department stores, branded shops, stylish cafes, theaters, and restaurants make this area the very center of Daegu.

2.28 Memorial Central Park

This park was established to commemorate the student democratic movement on February 28, 1960, against the dictatorship of the Liberal Party. It has become a symbolic site of Daegu's democratization and a cultural space that hosts performances and civic programs.

Gyodong gets its name from the Confucian school (hyanggyo) once located there. After the school moved to Namsan-dong, Gyodong Market was officially established in 1956. Its food alley lights up with visitors in the evening.

Wedding Street

Behind Daebaek Plaza is Wedding Street, a cluster of old hanbok shops, wedding boutiques, and massage parlors.

An artistic street filled with galleries, framing shops, and antique stores, comparable to Insadong in Seoul. The area has been newly renovated, with charming cafes and restaurants throughout.

Daegu Hyanggyo

A state-run Confucian academy for local education during the Joseon Dynasty. The front yard features Myeongnyundang and Nakyukjae buildings, while the back houses the Daeseongjeon shrine. It hosts traditional rites in spring and fall, teaches Chinese classics and etiquette, and is also used for traditional weddings.

Bangcheon Market

Located near Suseonggyo Bridge, connecting north and south Daegu, this market was formed by war refugees during the Korean War. Once so famous people visited from Cheongdo and Gyeongsan, it now thrives with retro-style bars and outdoor stalls.

Modern Cultural Alley

Daegu's modern history, from the spread of Christianity to the March 1st Independence Movement, lives on in the heart of the city.



March 1st Independence Movement Road

This road runs along Cheongna Hill and Jeil Church. Narrow and lined with concrete steps, it was used in 1919 to evade police during independence protests. From here, you can view Gyesan Cathedral.



Cheongna Hill

Known as Daegu's Montmartre, Cheongna Hill is the backdrop of the song 'Thinking of an Old Friend.' Three Western-style houses built by American missionaries in 1899 still stand here, showcasing various architectural blends. A replica of Jejungwon, the first modern Western medical clinic in Yeongnam, is also located here.

Jeil Church

Founded in 1893 by Rev. Baird, a missionary of the American Presbyterian Church, Jeil Church was the first in the Daegu-Gyeongbuk region. It played a key role in evangelism, medical service, and modern education. In 1996, it moved from Namseong-ro to its current location in Dongsan-dong.

This literary experience center showcases the autobiographical novel by Kim Won-il, set in post-war Daegu's Jung-gu. The story, later adapted into a TV drama, reveals the lives of war refugees.

Located in Gyesan-dong, this area features Gyesan Yega (a modern culture experience center), the former home of poet Yi Sang-hwa (famous for 'Will Spring come on the lost land'), and the house of Seo Sang-don, a businessman and independence activist who led the National Debt Repayment Movement. These traditional houses offer a glimpse into humble, refined lives.

Gyesan Cathedral

This Gothic-style cathedral is the third oldest in Korea, following Myeongdong Cathedral in Seoul and Gwanhori Cathedral in Pyongyang. It was designed by a French architect and built by Chinese craftsmen. It featured in the drama 'When Life Gives You Tangerines' as the wedding venue for the character Geum-myeong.

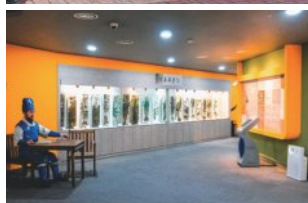


Yangnyeongsi Museum of Oriental Medicine

Daegu Yangnyeongsi

Established in the Joseon era, this market specialized in medicinal herbs. Today, the wholesale market thrives, and an annual Korean Medicine Culture Festival is held. Yakjeon Alley features a Medical herb museum and restaurants offering nourishing dishes like samgyetang (ginseng chicken soup).

Daegu became the capital of Gyeongsang Province when the office moved here in 1601. Later used as the Gyeongbuk provincial government building, it is now a park with fountains, stone walls, and gravel paths, an urban healing space.

Dalseong Park

Originally the earthen fortress of DalguBeol, a tribal state from the Samhan period, this is Korea's oldest existing fortress. Dalseong Park is the oldest and most beloved park in Daegu, featuring Gwanpungnu (the main gate of the Gyeongsang Provincial Office), a zoo, and a local history museum.

Dongdaegu Station & Beomeo Intersection

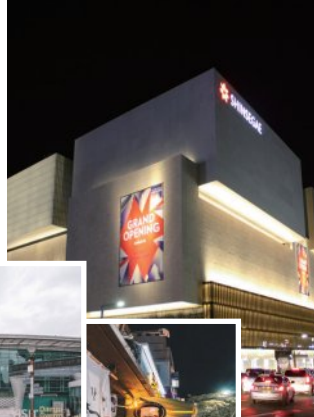
Dongdaegu Station, Daegu's main gateway, offers convenient access to food, cafes, and shopping.

Beomeo Intersection

Indongchon Anago Alley

Located where Indongchon Market once stood near Dalseong Fortress, this alley specializes in grilled fresh sea eel (anago) served with spicy sauce.

A section of Seobu Market transformed into a dining area. 'Omigami' means 'coming and going' in dialect. It features sashimi, grilled fish, pubs, and more.

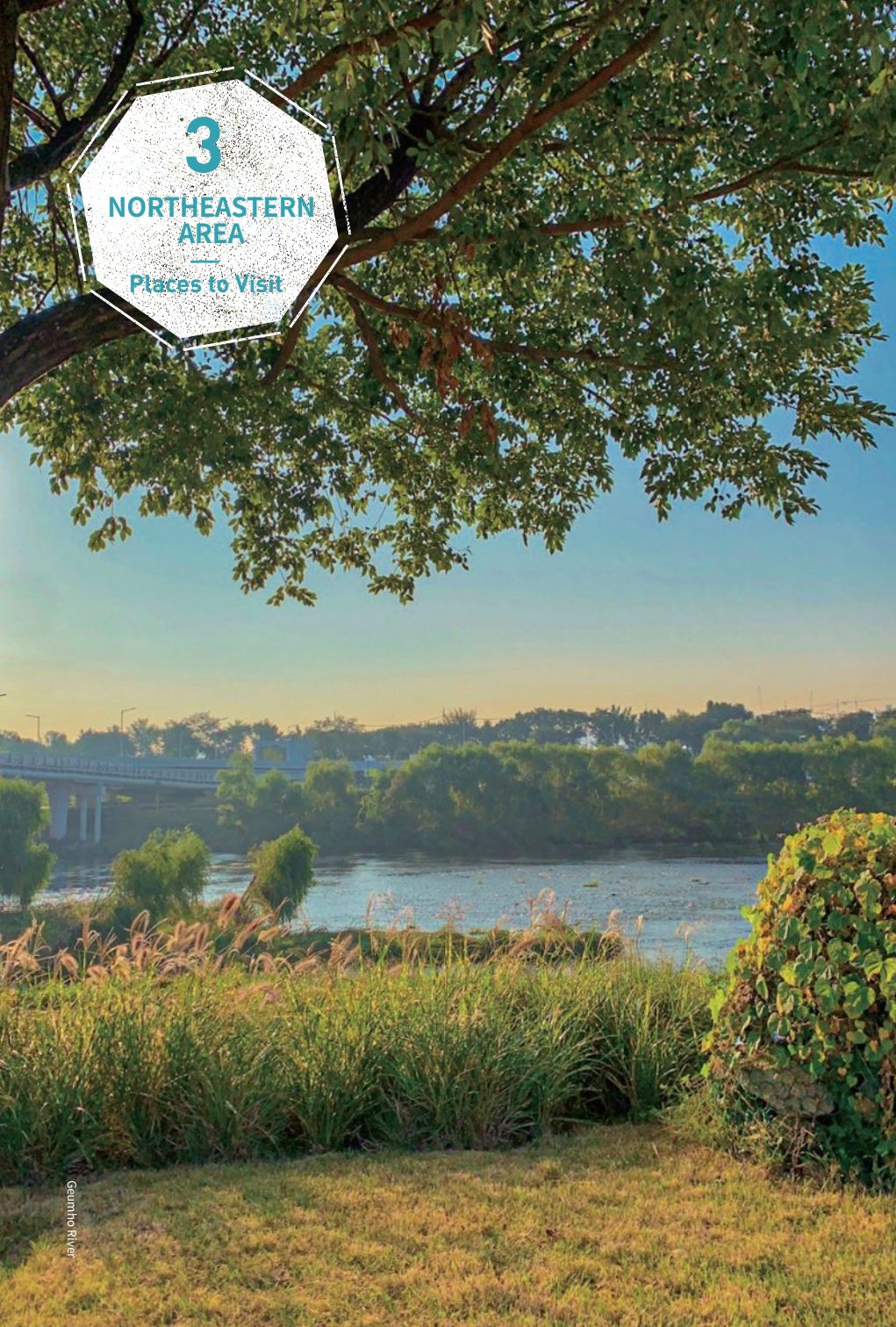

Palgongsan Mountain

Make a wish at Gatbawi and experience the serene beauty of Donghwasa, a thousand-year-old temple.



Palgongsan National Park

The main peak, Birobong (1,193m), is flanked by Dongbong and Seobong like wings, embracing the Daegu Basin like a folding screen. There are eight Olle trails on Palgongsan for walking tours through cultural heritage sites. The cable car takes just 7 minutes to reach the Palgongsan observatory at 820m above sea level.

Gatbawi

“Have you heard the saying that Buddha on the rock will grant at least one wish?” Gatbawi is the most famous site on Palgongsan. Officially called Gwanbong Seated Stone Buddha, it is a 4-meter-tall Buddha statue atop Gwanbong Peak at 850m above sea level. The stone on its head resembles a traditional Korean hat, giving it the name Gatbawi (stone hat rock). Every year, many people visit to make sincere wishes.

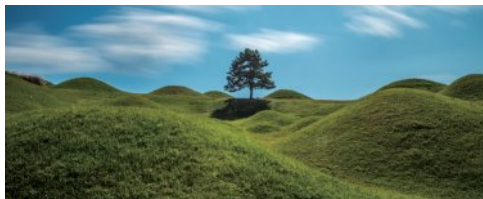

Bulldong Tomb park

On the low hills of Bulldong near the Geumho River are around 200 tombs densely clustered, creating a striking view. These tombs are believed to be the communal burial site of local ruling families from the Three Kingdoms period, dating back 1,500 years. They are designated as a historic site. The mounds are well preserved, measuring approximately 15–20 meters in diameter and about 4 meters high.

Palgongsan is considered a sacred place of Buddhism, with many temples nestled in its valleys. Among them, Donghwasa, founded in 493 by Buddhist monk Geukdal, is the largest temple in Daegu and the head temple of the 9th district of the Jogye Order. In October, the Palgongsan Seungsil (Monks' Market) Festival offers a glimpse into the austere lives of monks.

Hajungdo (Geumho Flower Island)

Located between Paldalgyo and Nogokgyo bridges on the Geumho River, this island is also known as Geumho Flower Island. It showcases seasonal flowers, canola and green barley in spring, cosmos, reeds, burning bush, and pink muhly in fall, making it a popular year-round attraction. The Daegu Garden Expo is held here in October.

The name Geumho (琴湖), meaning harp lake, originates from 'the sound the reeds make when the wind blows and the river's calm, clear surface.' The river flows through Dongchon-dong, merges with the Munam Stream, and eventually joins the Nakdong River after meeting Sincheon. A cycling path runs along the Geumho River all the way to the Nakdong River.

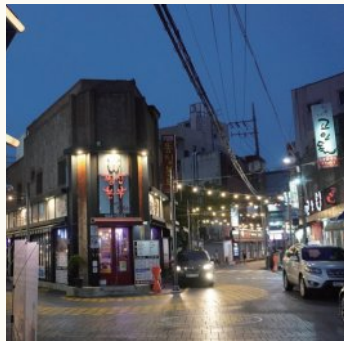

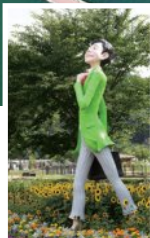
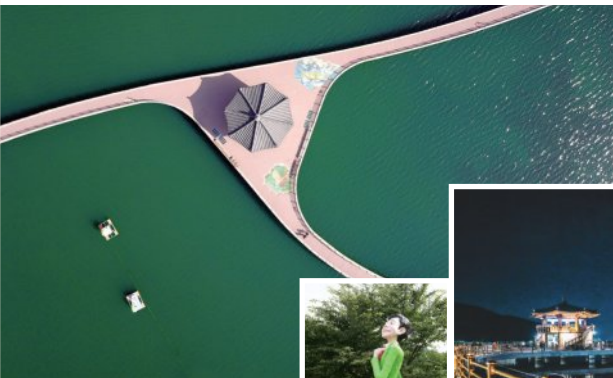

Okyeonji Songhae Park

A reservoir in Gise-ri, Okpo-eup, Dalseong-gun, has been transformed into Okiyeonji Songhae Park, named after the beloved national MC Song Hae, becoming a major local attraction. As a displaced person from North Korea, Song Hae met his wife, Mrs. Seok-ok of Gise-ri, while serving as a communications officer in Daegu and came to think of the area as his second hometown, visiting frequently. The park features the Songhae Trail, a giant waterwheel, Songhae Centenarian Bridge and Pavilion. At the nearby Songhae Memorial Hall and Scholar Experience Center, lectures on Dalseong-gun's nature, history, and humanities are held free of charge.

Biseulsan Mountain

Its highest peak is 1,084 meters. The name Biseul comes from the mountain's silhouette, said to resemble a Taoist hermit playing a stringed instrument. In spring, azaleas; in summer, valleys; in autumn, colorful foliage and silver grass; in winter, ice formations. All offer spectacular seasonal views. There are 11 trail courses to enjoy the natural scenery.

Dalseong Korea-Japan Friendship Center · Nokdong Confucian Academy

The Dalseong Korea-Japan Friendship Center exhibits the history of Korea-Japan exchange from the Three Kingdoms period through Joseon to the modern era. Next to it, Nokdong Confucian Academy commemorates Kim Chung-seon (Japanese name: Sayaka), who defected from the Japanese army during the Imjin War, received a Korean surname and name, and settled in Nokchon (Wurok-ri, Dalseong-gun, Daegu). He inspired the character 'Junsa' in the film <Hansan: Rising Dragon>. The academy was built in 1791 by local Confucian scholars to honor Kim Chung-seon's great contributions during the Imjin War, Jeongyu War, and the Manchu Invasion.

Inheung Village (Namphyeong Mun Clan's Bonri Settlement)

A traditional folk village built on the site of the old Inheungsa Temple by Mun Gyeong-ho, 18th descendant of Mun Ik-jeom, as a settlement for the Namphyeong Mun clan. Visitors can see old houses like Gwanggeodang and Subongjeonsa. The village is a valuable resource for understanding the layout of Joseon-era villages and the architectural traits of early modern Hanok. Along the earthen wall path are beautiful flowers and a humble cotton field, creating a scenic landscape. In summer, it is particularly famous for trumpet creeper flowers.

Daegu Arboretum

A former landfill transformed into an ecological plant park. It features over 1,000 species of herbaceous and woody plants. As an urban arboretum, it offers educational nature spaces including a wildflower garden, rock garden, aquatic garden, aromatic garden, medicinal garden, cactus greenhouse, dye plant garden, and the Forest Culture Exhibition Hall.

Samunjin Jumakchon Village

Samunjin, where the Nakdong and Geumho Rivers meet, means 'a gate of sand-laden beach.' Once a bustling port for merchant boats, it served as a central trading hub with Japan and a symbolic place for traveling peddlers. Samunjin Tavern Village now sells various foods including traditional rice wine (makgeolli). Visitors can enjoy river cruises, and the site is where Korea's first piano was introduced, hence the annual 'Dalseong 100 Piano Festival.'

Dodong Seowon Confucian Academy

One of Korea's five major Confucian academies, it was established to honor Han Hwangang Kim Goeng-pil. The site embodies the Neo-Confucian worldview in its spatial layout and is known for its beautiful surrounding landscape. It was designated as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site in 2019. A ginkgo tree that has stood in front of the courtyard for over 400 years adds to its historical value.

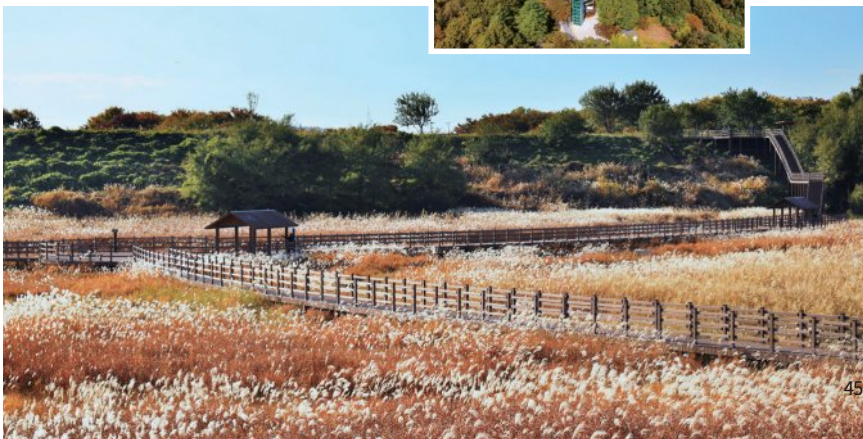
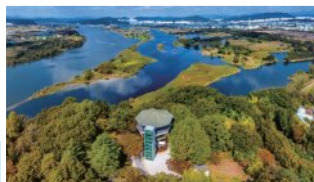
A cultural pavilion built along the Nakdong River as part of the Four Rivers Project. It is loved for its artistic architecture inspired by water, rivers, and nature. The basement houses the Four Rivers Exhibition Hall; the 1st and 2nd floors feature a circular video zone themed around the cycle of life; and the 3rd floor is an observatory for relaxation. The surrounding park is great for picnics and cycling.

Dalseong Wetland · Daemyeong Reservoir

The village also operates a direct market selling chemical-free produce like organically grown dropwort and vegetables harvested from home gardens.

Gunwi

A region where rich history and nature blend harmoniously with everyday life, offering a serene yet captivating atmosphere.



Hye-won's House (Filming Location of the Movie 'Little Forest')

'Little Forest' tells the story of a protagonist weary from the hardships of city life, who finds healing through sharing wholesome, homemade food with old friends in nature. Attracting 1.5 million viewers, the film's shooting location is well preserved. Visitors can explore the interior of Hye-won's (played by actress Kim Tae-ri) house, and even rent the bicycle featured in the film.

Hwabon Village (Hwabon Station)

Hwabon Village is known for its mural alley featuring Master Ilyeon, author of Samguk Yusa, and for its cultural village 'When Mom and Dad Were Young,' which recreates a 1970s-era village in a renovated former school. Hwabon Station, designated a quasi-railroad monument by Korea Railroad Corporation, was voted the most beautiful small station by netizens. Though train services ceased in 2024, the station remains open to the public free of charge.

Hwasan Village

A pristine highland village at 700m elevation, known for growing cool-climate vegetables. Often called the first village under the sky, it's famous for breathtaking scenes of starry dawn skies, misty valleys, and sunrise views from Hwasan. At the village entrance hill stands a red-roofed windmill observatory. A place where nature truly heals the soul.

Ilyeon Park

This park was created downstream of the Gunwi Dam to honor Ilyeon (1206–1289), a monk and scholar from the Goryeo Dynasty. Attractions include the Ilyeon Waterfall flowing down a rocky cliff, a water playground, ecological pond, riverside trails, and a multipurpose sports field, making it a popular spot for exercise, family outings, and car camping.

Grotto of Amitabha Buddha Triad (Samjon Seokgul)

Designated as a National Treasure, this granite grotto (sometimes called the Second Seokguram) was established in the 15th year of Silla's King Soji (493 AD) by the monk Geukdal. Situated 20 meters up a rock cliff, it enshrines the Amitabha Buddha, Mahasthamaprapta, and Avalokiteshvara in a natural cave. The grotto, temple, and surrounding scenery are beautiful, making it a perfect place for a meditative Buddhist experience.

Palgongsan Sky Garden

To reach the summit of Palgongsan Mountain from Gunwi-gun, one must pass through this park, located near the summit. Covering 6,000㎡, it offers various rest facilities, serving as a welcome break for hikers. It's also near Wonhyo Cave, said to be a place where the great monk Wonhyo once practiced, making it worth visiting together.

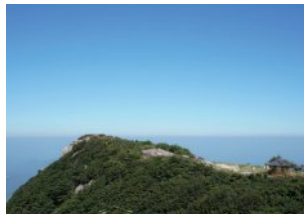

Ingaksa Temple

Within the grounds are the Seated Stone Buddha Statue of Ingaksa, the Stupa of Bogak Guksa, and his memorial stele. In front of the temple lies picturesque Hakso-dae, once home to many white cranes.
