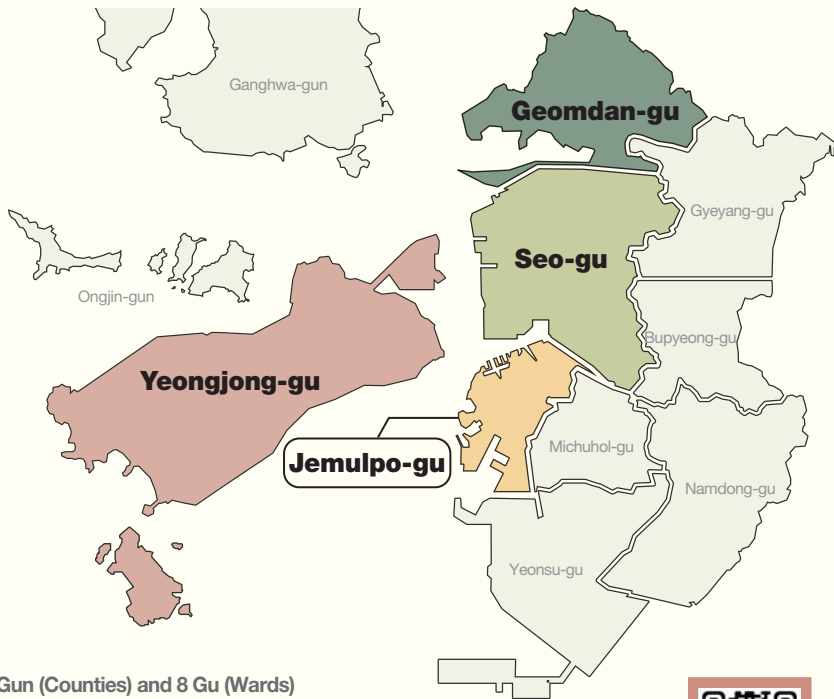

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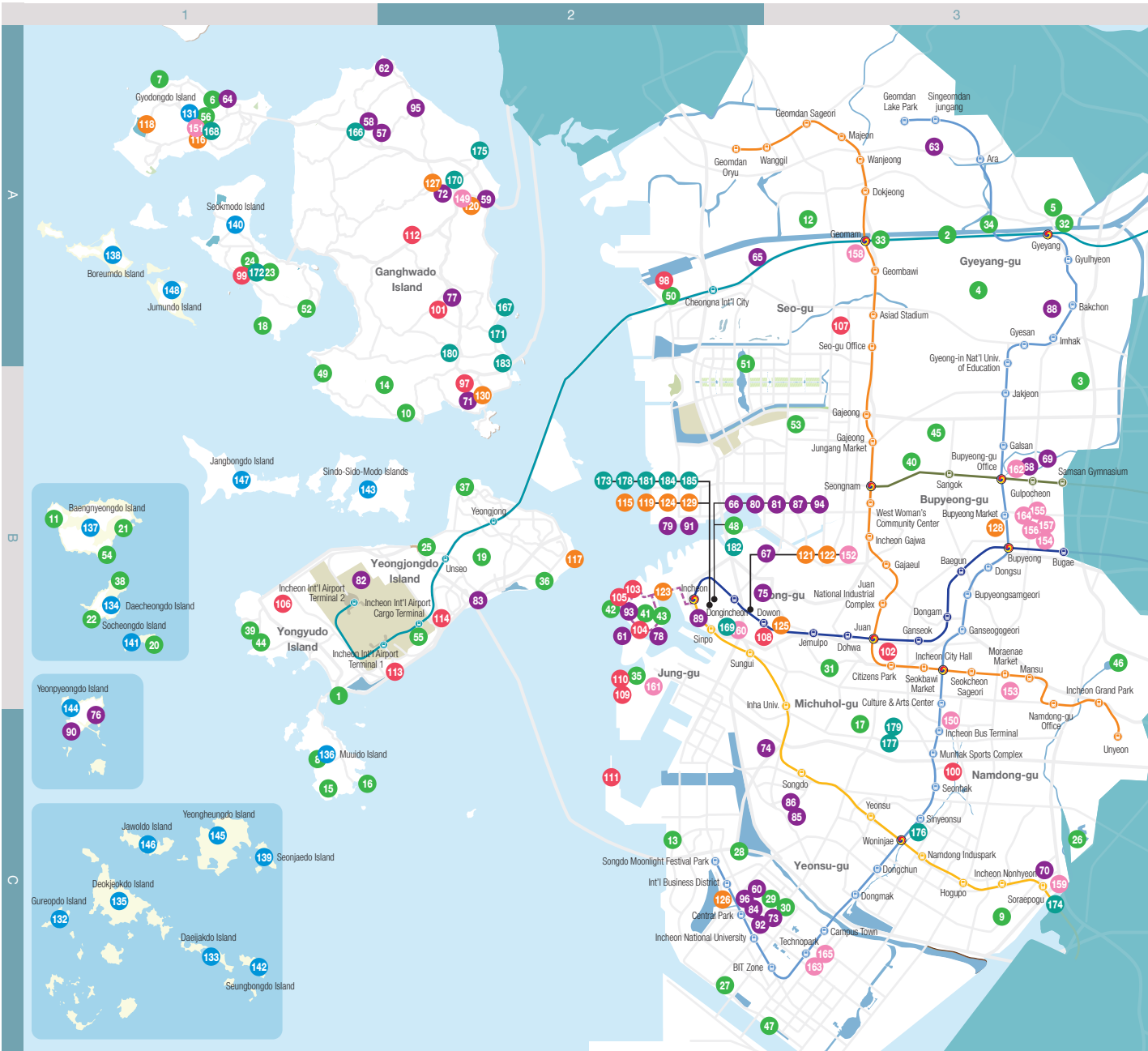

Incheon is a city where sea and sky, past and present, come together. From the port's opening history to the tranquil island landscapes and the image of a future city, Incheon offers a diverse range of scenes. Let's take a moment to explore the unique experience along the nine scenic spots of Incheon, which are both unfamiliar and familiar.



1 Open Port Area

Travel Back in Time to the Open Port Area in 1883

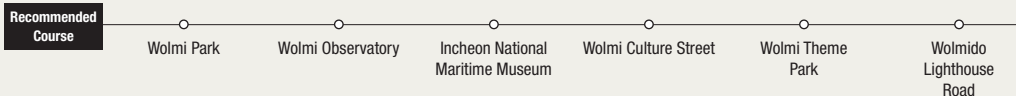
The open port area, into which Western civilization came after Jemulpo Port opened in 1883, still retains traces from modern times. The Incheon Art Platform, Jemulpo Club, Jung-gu Living History Museum, and Daebul Hotel Exhibition have restored the exteriors and interiors of old buildings, vividly conveying the vibe of the time. Electric car tours and romantic nightscapes are other ways to enjoy the open port area.



2 Wolmido Island

Enjoy Romantic Wolmido Island on Wolmi Sea Train

Korea's first and longest urban monorail, Wolmi Sea Train, runs in a circular route along the Wolmido Island's coastline starting from Incheon Station. It visits major tourist attractions, including the Silo Mural, Incheon Port, the West Sea Sunset, Wolmi Culture Street, and Wolmi Theme Park, allowing passengers to enjoy the coastal city of Incheon's views at leisure. Feel the special vibe of Wolmido Island as you leisurely travel along the ocean.



3 Sorae Port

Enjoy the Ecological Nature at Sorae Port, a Port in the City

Sorae Port, where traditional fishing villages and the city coexist, is Incheon's representative ecotourism destination and a hub of fish market culture. At Soraeogu Complex Fish Market, you can taste freshly caught seafood on the spot. At the same time, Sorae Marsh Ecological Park's salt farms, windmills, seawater footbaths, and reed fields are popular destinations for ecological experiences throughout the year. Sorae Port is a precious marine travel destination within the city, perfect for family outings and a taste of a fishing village.

See the Street of Light at Gyeyang Araon, a Famous Nighttime Attraction

The Gyeyang Araon Street of Light, located in the Gyeyang-gu section of the Gyeongin Ara Waterway, has quickly emerged as Incheon's representative nighttime attraction, combining attractions such as Suhyangwon and the Hwangeo Market. LED sculptures have been installed along the waterfront trail, dyeing the entire area in a fantastic glow at night. Great for families and couples to take a stroll, it is considered a unique nighttime experience in the city, offering a sense of healing.

Walk to Explore Ganghwa-eup's Original City Center

From the Goryeo Palace Site Ganghwa to Joyang Bangjick, the Ganghwa Anglican Church of Korea, and the Sochang Fabric Experience Hall, Ganghwa-eup's original city center is a place where traces of history and the atmosphere of life coexist. The Ganghwa Pungmul Market, filled with local specialties like hwamunseok (Korean traditional mat), mugwort, and turnips, shows the life in Ganghwa. When you take a stroll through the tile-roofed alleys, you will come to a moment where the past flows into the present.

Meet the Seal, a Natural Monument, on Baengnyeongdo Island, South Korea's Northernmost Island

Baengnyeongdo Island, the northernmost island in the West Sea, is home to natural wonders carved over millennia, from the rocky cliffs of Dumujin to the firm sands of Sagot Beach and the mysteriously rising Yongtrimbawi Rock. Spotted seals, in particular, inhabit the area annually and can be observed near Seal Rock.

Incheon Grand Park Cherry Blossom Festival

Incheon Citizen Love House

It was originally a Japanese-style house built in 1913, later turned into the residence of the Incheon Mayor, a historical museum, and finally a cultural space for citizens in 2021. It hosts book talks, exhibitions, and educational programs, while also preserving remnants of foreign settlements from the port-opening period and offering a view of Incheon Port.

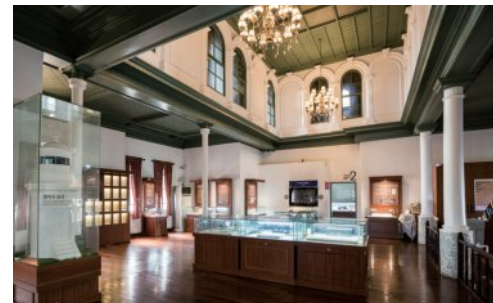

Steps Between Qing and Japanese Settlements

These are the steps built along the boundary between Qing and Japanese settlements when the port opened in 1883. It is a historical site that symbolically marks the division between the inner space of the open port area and the remains of foreign settlements.

Hongyemun Gate

It is an arch stone gate that served as a passage connecting Incheon Port and the inland area, built shortly after the port opened in 1883. It still maintains its original form and remains a prominent example of modern cultural heritage in Jung-gu.

Jayu Park (Freedom Park)

It is Korea's first Western-style modern park. Built on a hill that was once a foreign settlement during the port-opening period, it offers a panoramic view of Incheon Port and the surrounding streets. With the statue of General MacArthur and the Korea-U.S.A. Centennial Monument, visitors can explore both its history and natural scenery.

Dapdong Cathedral

It is Incheon's first Gothic-style cathedral, built in the 1890s. Red bricks, a sharp spire, and stained glass create a striking scene. It is a religious building established during the period of port opening, reflecting Western cultural influence, and it remains a living cultural heritage where masses are still held.

Incheon Open Port Culture Night

It is a tour of the nightscape of modern buildings held under the evening sky. A walk along the illuminated alleys into history to explore scenes of the open port area from a century ago.



Modern Costume Experience

Travel back in time wearing costumes from the 1890s. At the experience room, try out outfits from the Enlightenment period and create special memories against the alleys of the open port area as your backdrop.

Open Port Electric Car Tour

Ride the electric vehicle through major historical and cultural sites in the open port area. It's a public transportation-based tour that allows visitors to enjoy the scenery with commentary instead of walking.



Sangsang Platform

It's a vibrant cultural space transformed from an old grain depot. Culture and daily life blend through exhibits, performances, and interactive activities. With a cafe, museum, and studio overlooking the sea, it's ideal for spending extended time and enjoying the atmosphere.

This museum, converted from a 1930s Chinese restaurant called ‘Gonghwachun,’ showcases the history of jajangmyeon (black bean noodles) and how it has evolved over time. The kitchen, hall, and living spaces are restored to allow visitors to explore food history and immigration, offering a glimpse into Incheon’s culinary culture during the port-opening era and the lives of Chinese immigrants.

Culinary Travel in Chinatown

From jajangmyeon, which originated in Incheon, to dumplings, crunchy balloon bread, and oven dumplings, a variety of flavors developed over a century or more are available in every alley. A unique culinary journey through Chinatown begins right where authentic Chinese food and exotic scenery mingle.



Chinese Cuisine

In Chinatown, you can taste a variety of Chinese dishes. With staples like jajangmyeon (black bean noodles) and jjamppong (spicy seafood noodle soup), you can also enjoy items like palbochae (stir-fried seafood and vegetables) and lajogi (stir-fried chicken with hot sauce) served in different styles at each restaurant.



Street Food

You can find various street foods like crunch balloon bread, mooncakes, and tanghulu in the alleys of Chinatown. Snacks that you can enjoy simply add to the excitement of the trip.

Three Kingdoms Mural Street - Legend of Chu and Han Mural Street

Murals three-dimensionally depicting scenes from the Three Kingdoms and the Legend of Chu and Han unfold along the steps in the middle of Chinatown. Walking past the familiar characters, such as Liu Fei, Guan Yu, Hsiang Yu, and Liu Bang, visitors can experience the unique street themed on stories from the classics. Due to their vibrant colors and intricate details, it is also a popular photo spot.

Emperor Stairs, Chinatown

It is a themed set of steps for a unique experience, built on the uphill passage in Chinatown. It has five sections, each themed around King’s Way, Emperor’s Audience, Journey to Paradise, Journey along the Great Wall, and Peaches in the Peach Garden. The steps and walls are decorated with traditional Chinese patterns and symbols, creating a visually distinct atmosphere of Chinatown.

Uiseondang Shrine

It is the only Chinese shrine in Korea. It opened in 1850, before the opening of the port, under the name of Hwaeomsa Temple. It is a symbolic space that reflects the faith and traditional culture of the overseas Chinese community.

Korean-Chinese Cultural Center

It is a cultural museum established to commemorate the tenth anniversary of diplomatic relations between Korea and China. The first floor features traditional Chinese folk crafts, while the second floor houses the Incheon Overseas Chinese History Hall, which showcases the immigration history and life of overseas Chinese who settled in Incheon. Using various audio-visual materials and relics, the center vividly presents the cultural identity of overseas Chinese and highlights the flow of exchange.

Incheon Overseas Chinese History and Culture Museum (Jungsan Overseas Chinese School)

It is a museum established within the building of Jungsan Overseas Chinese School. Focused on the history of the school founded in the 1920s and the education and community culture of overseas Chinese in Incheon, it displays various relics such as diplomas, textbooks, photographs, and daily supplies. It remains an educational space that teaches students and serves as a meaningful place to vividly understand the roots and identity of the overseas Chinese community.

UNIQUE POINTS



Pai-lou

It is a traditional Chinese gate placed at the entrance of Chinatown. The red columns and golden dragon decorations are striking. This pai-lou, donated to honor the sisterhood relationship between Incheon and Weihai in China, serves as a symbolic gateway to little China in Korea and is a key structure marking the start of Chinatown. Gyodong Hyanggyo Confucian School was established in the fifth year of King Injong's reign during the Goryeo Dynasty, when 'Munseonggong' An Hyang brought statues of Confucius and Zhu Xi upon returning from his visit to Yuan. He set up a shrine here and enshrined their portraits. Gyodong Eupseong Fortress, built in the seventh year of King Injo of the Joseon Dynasty, is located near Gyodong Hyanggyo Confucian School.

Into the Islands

Into the Islands Traveling through Incheon's Islands

Incheon's islands scattered across the sea take on different faces. A stream of trails along the mudflat and of fishing village scenes on Sindo-Sido-Modo Islands, the wind scrapes the forest and beach on Deokjeokdo and Gureopdo Islands, serenity seeps in through Daeijakdo and Seungbongdo Islands, and the memories of the ends of the West Sea remain in Baengnyeongdo, Daechongdo, and Yeonpyeongdo Islands. Sceneries may vary, but the time spent on each island is intertwined. 'Into the Islands' is a journey to explore a different side of Incheon through a walk around a peaceful island.

ISLANDS WITH STORIES

On the bridge connecting the islands, the day drifts along the trail of electric bikes. Carrying their own stories, Sindo-Sido-Modo Islands and Jangbongdo Island greet travelers through footprints in the sand and the tide washed away by the waves.

Gubongsan Mountain, Sindo Island

Gubongsan Mountain is the tallest peak on Sindo Island and gets its name from its nine summits (Gubong). From the summit, you can see large and small islands in the West Sea, and among many stunning views, the seascape at sunset, tinged in red, is especially beautiful. It's an excellent spot for an open view and a light hike.

Jangbongdo Laver

With clean seawater, strong sunlight, and favorable tidal currents, the waters around Jangbongdo Island create ideal conditions for laver farming. Jangbongdo laver, in particular, is produced using traditional methods that avoid hydrochloric acid, resulting in a crispy texture and rich flavor.

Islands fill the day with different terrains and scenery, like the forest trail on Deokjeokdo Island and the hills on Gureopdo Island. Walking along paths that lead to forests, beaches, and hills naturally reveals various features of the islands, giving travelers a closer look at them.

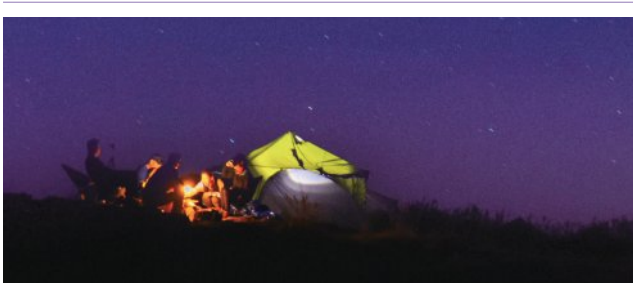

It is the main beach of Gureopdo Island, about 1 km from the island's dock. It is also called 'Keunmal Beach' because of its location beneath 'Keunmal,' the only village on Gureopdo Island. This beach is also the most visited spot before and after hiking, as most visitors to the island stay in Keunmal village.

Meet Deers in Traveling

It is common to say there are more deer on Gureopdo Island than people. Anyone walking along Gaemeori Hill can easily see wild deer moving in groups. Since the entire island is designated as an ecological preservation area, development is restricted, and the natural environment is maintained almost as it is. Due to these unique ecological characteristics, Gureopdo Island is called the 'Galapagos of Korea.' Considering that most travelers to the island are backpackers, Gaemeori Hill is regarded as a sanctuary that every backpacker should visit at least once.

Islands tell their stories through calm scenery along the rocky shore of Daeijakdo Island and the pebble path of Seungbongdo Island. A walk listening to gentle waves and strolling under the shade of pine trees will slow your steps and immerse you in the island's tranquility.

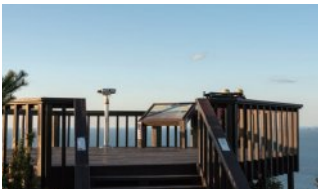

Puldeung

It is a tidal sand island that emerges only at low tide. A wide sand plain, 1 km across and 3 km long, extends toward Gureopdo Island. It appears for about six hours each day, so visitors should check the tide times before visiting.

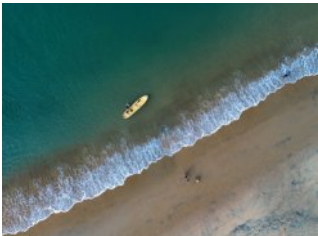
Soijakdo Island

It is a small island accessible by boat from Daeijakdo Island. On the beach cliff, there is a rock that rises toward the sea like a finger and is called 'Songarakbawi (finger rock),' which is known as a symbol of this island. The island has a myth that treasures from a wrecked ship are hidden here, and some areas, called 'Geumeunbohwa Wolpabyeok,' are decorated with murals depicting a treasure island with figures and colors.

Ille Beach

It is a beach located on the southeastern side of Seungbongdo Island, characterized by a half-moon-shaped sandy shoreline and clear seawater. The water is transparent, as the mudflat isn't visible even at low tide. It's a great spot for relaxing baths and walks along the dense pine forest surrounding the beach.

Namdaemunbawi Rock (Elephant Rock)

It is a natural rock with an arch formed by wave and wind erosion. It was named after its shape, which resembles a 'Natural Gate.' It is also called 'Kokkiribawi Rock (elephant rock)' because it appears like an elephant from certain angles.

Chotdaebawi Rock & Buchaebawi Rock

Chotdaebawi Rock is an eroded sea stack that rises from a seashore cliff. Its pointed top led to its name, 'chotdae' (candlestick). A deck has been installed for easy access and viewing. Buchaebawi Rock is a fan-shaped (buchaebawi) rock face that spreads widely. It becomes visible on the shore when the tide recedes at low tide.

Jawoldo Island

The name Jawoldo (Red Moon) comes from a myth that the moon turned red, the wind rose, and a rainstorm hit the island to ease the resentment from exile. Mokseom Island is a must-visit spot when you're in Jawoldo. It's located on the shore to the right of Dalbawi Dock, and with the pedestrian flyover connecting Mokseom Island, it feels like you're walking on the sea.



Baengnyeongdo, Daecheongdo, and Yeonpyeongdo Islands

ISLANDS OF MEMORY AT THE END OF THE WEST SEA

The tree islands across the sea, on the edges of the West Sea, carry the marks of history along with their unique geographical features: cliffs shaped by the waves, pebbles rolling beneath feet, a guard post and lighthouse on one side, and winds hitting the rocks on the other.

While walking through the scenery, the island quietly evokes that memory.

Kongdol Beach

Kongdol Beach is designated as Natural Monument No. 392. The entire 2 km shoreline is covered with pebbles, allowing visitors to walk on them or lie down as if taking a bath. The beach is renowned for the sound produced when pebbles bump into each other during waves crashing onto the shore, and its geographic features are highly valued in marine geology.

UNIQUE POINTS



Baengnyeong-Daecheong Geopark

The area around Baengnyeongdo and Daecheongdo Islands features distinctive natural scenery created by coastal erosion and granite topography. It was officially designated as a national geopark in 2019. It includes geological attractions such as Dumujin, Daecheongdo Seopungbaji Cliff, and Socheongdo Bunbawi Rock. Due to various sedimentary structures preserved over 1 billion years, it has been protected and used for ecology, landscape, and education in addition to its geological significance.



Dumujin

The shoreline created by eternity and a unique rock formation that looks as if it floats on the sea offers a magnificent view. On a ferry, you can enjoy a comprehensive view of Dumujin at a glance, while on foot, you can explore the inside of Dumujin. From Dumujin, the view of North Korea spreads before your eyes as if you could reach out and touch it.

Sagot Beach

It is a rare natural sand runway found worldwide. It submerges in the sea at high tide and reappears at low tide. The sand is fine and firm, allowing airplanes to land, making it one of the main tourist attractions of Baengnyeongdo Island.

Baengnyeongdo Seal

The sea around Baengnyeongdo Island is home to spotted seals, which are designated as Natural Monument No. 331. It is the only place in Korea where you can see seals in their natural habitat. Passengers on a tour boat can get a close-up view of the seals resting on the rocks near Dumujin's shore, with their numbers peaking between April and June. The seals of Baengnyeongdo Island are also designated as Incheon's mascot promoting marine protection.

Island Created by Wind and Time, Daecheongdo Island



Okjookdong Desert

This is a sand dune on Daecheongdo Island, with a sandy beach naturally shaped by sea wind stretching along the coast. Known as the Sahara of Korea, this rare coastal dune boasts fine, soft sand that seems like it could be swept away even by a gentle breeze.

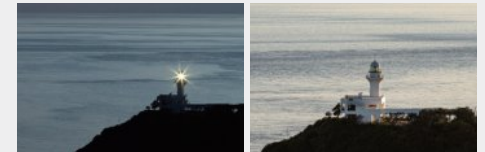

It is a security-themed tour destination that allows visitors to experience the pain of national division both directly and indirectly.

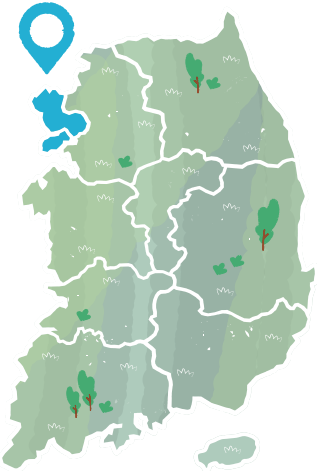

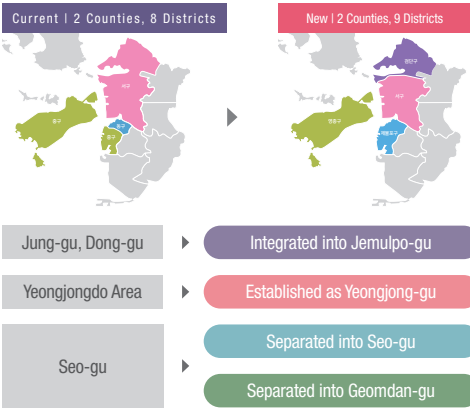

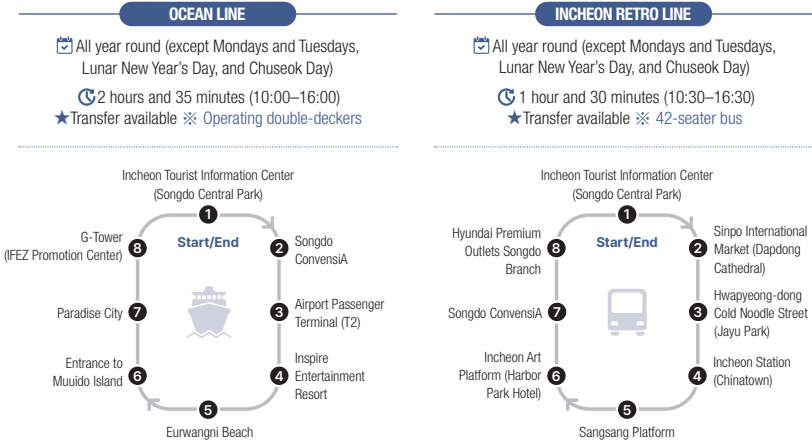

WOLMI SEA TRAIN



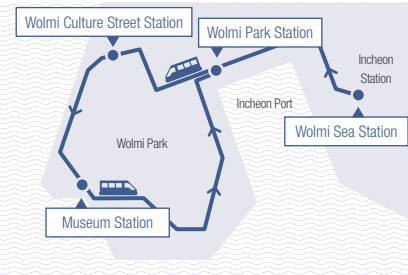

The airport railroad provides the fastest and most comfortable way to travel between Incheon International Airport and Seoul Station. Passengers can easily reach downtown Incheon via Geomam Station, where they can transfer to Incheon Line 2, or Gyeyang Station, which connects to Incheon Line 1. Two train types operate: the ‘Express Train,’ which runs nonstop between Seoul Station and Incheon International Airport Station, and the ‘All Stop Train,’ a commuter-style train that stops at all 14 stations.
