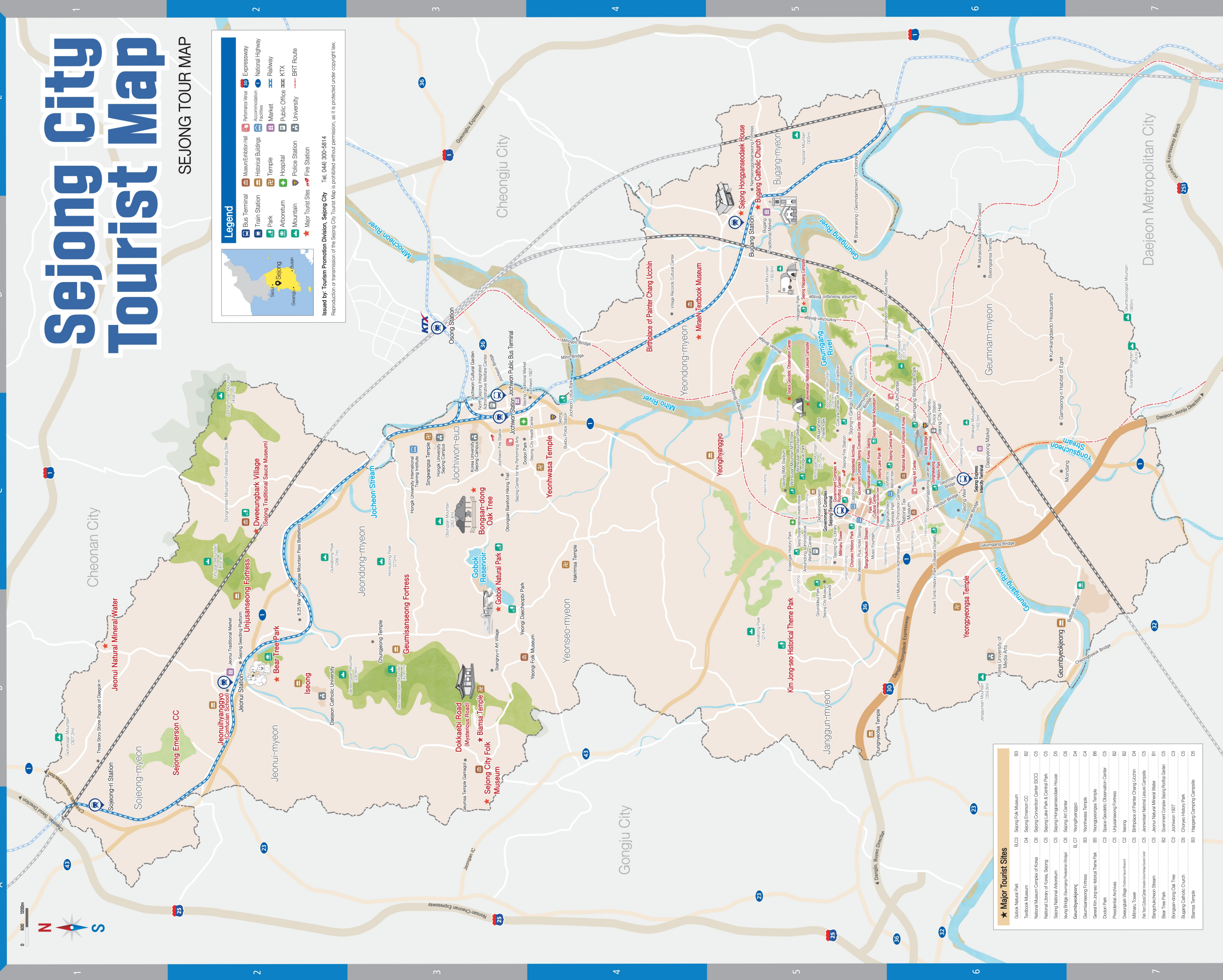
Sejong City Tourist Map

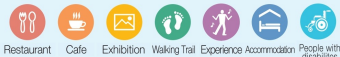

Journey Through Living History

Sejong Bugang Catholic Church (National Registered Cultural Heritage)



Constructed in 1962, Sejong Bugang Catholic Church includes an original Hanok building that served as the main church before the current cathedral was built. This site holds architectural rarity and also reflects the historical context of Catholic missions in the region, making it highly valued for both its religious and historical significance.

Unjusanseong Fortress



Spanning a perimeter of 3,210 meters with a width of 2 meters and heights ranging from 2 to 5 meters, Unjusanseong Fortress is a grand Goguryeo fortification. The fortress is constructed entirely of stone and includes both an outer and an inner wall, with remnants of various structures. A hike from the entrance to the peak offers expansive views over Cheonan and Cheongju.

Jeung Bridge (Geumgang Pedestrian Bridge)



Built to commemorate the year 1446, when King Jeongjong promulgated Hanguk, Jeung Bridge, with a circumference of 1,446 meters, connects the central green space on the north side of the Geumgang River with the waterfront park on the south. It is considered one of Sejong City's iconic landmarks.

National Library of Korea, Sejong



Opened in December 2013 as Korea's first policy-specialized library, its exterior, inspired by the motif of an open book, has become a symbolic landmark of downtown Sejong City.

Sejong Lake Park



Sejong Lake Park features five artificial islands: Festival Island, a hub for various festivals; Water Stage Island, set to become Korea's top water stage; Water Play Island, offering beach-like activities; Water Flower Island, rich with aquatic plants and an ecological wetland; and Wetland Point, enhancing the park's biodiversity.

Sejong Central Park



Sejong Central Park is a large urban green space of approximately 188,000 m², offering a range of facilities including playgrounds for festivals and events, a multi-sports complex for enjoying over a dozen sports, a Family Leisure Forest for family-friendly recreation, and a Family Arts Forest for small cultural performances. It is a place where visitors can enjoy nature and experience healthy, relaxing outdoor activities.

Sejong Hongpansodaek House (National Folk Cultural Heritage)



Built in 1866, during the third year of King Gojong's reign, this traditional Hanok residence faces south, overlooking Bugang-ri Village. It exemplifies the typical architecture of a nobleman's house in central Korea during the Joseon Dynasty and is arranged in a "4-1" shape. The house is well-preserved, retaining much of its original structure and historical integrity.

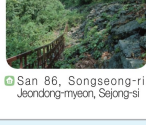
Biamsa Temple (Dokkaebi Road (Mysterious Road))



In 1960, several significant artifacts were discovered here, including the National Treasure Buddhist Stale of Amabasha with inscription of "Gyeon Year," the Treasure Stale of Amabasha Buddha with inscription of "Gukuk Year," and the Pensile Bocheastha Stale, all currently preserved at the Cheongju National Museum. The temple is surrounded by forest and is seldom visited, offering a tranquil atmosphere reminiscent of ancient mountain temples. One of the main attractions is an 800-year-old zelkova tree, and the path leading to Biamsa Temple, known as Dokkaebi Road (Mysterious Road), creates the illusion of an uphill climb.

Geumisanseong Fortress



Geumisanseong Fortress stands prominently on Jeonwolsan Mountain (424m), extending north of Jeonui-myeon toward Cheonan. The fortress has a perimeter of 714 meters and offers commanding views of Jeonui and Cheonan to the north, and the Geumgang River to the south. Built in the traditional Baekje architectural style with early Unified Silla modifications, the fortress was constructed using the rugged mountain terrain to strengthen its defense, earning it the nickname "iron fortress." It remains a popular destination for middle and high school field trips and is recognized as an important historical site.

Government Complex Sejong Rooftop Garden



Recognized in 2016 as the world's largest rooftop garden in the Guinness Book of Records, the Government Sejong Complex, shaped like a rising dragon, has become a landmark of Sejong City. It is praised for breaking away from traditional architectural forms and for its modern reinterpretation of the walls of a historical city.

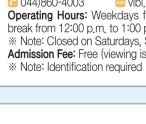

Space Geodetic Observation Center



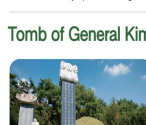
This observatory is the only facility in South Korea equipped with ultra-precision space geodetic technology. It houses the country's largest antenna, measuring 22 meters in diameter and 28 meters in height. As the sixteenth such installation globally and the third in Asia, this site provides access to a range of information on space geodesics and is expected to become a distinguished landmark in Sejong City.

Yeongpyeongsa Temple



Yeongpyeongsa Temple is a traditional temple that operates as a branch of Haeinsa under the sixth sect of the Joseon Order of Korea Buddhism. Located on Jangnamsan Mountain, the temple is known for its clean water and air. It is surrounded by vibrant seasonal flowers such as columbine, white lotus, and chrysanthemums, and hosts the annual Chrysanthemum Festival every October. Visitors can also experience a templestay at the temple.

Tomb of General Kim Jong-seo



This is the grave of General Kim Jong-seo (1138-1453), a loyal subject during the reign of King Danjong. In the 18th year of King Sejong's reign (1434), he established six military outposts, greatly contributing to the nation's territorial expansion. The ancient tombstone and the plaque bearing the title "Loyal Subject" were erected during the reign of King Jeongjo.

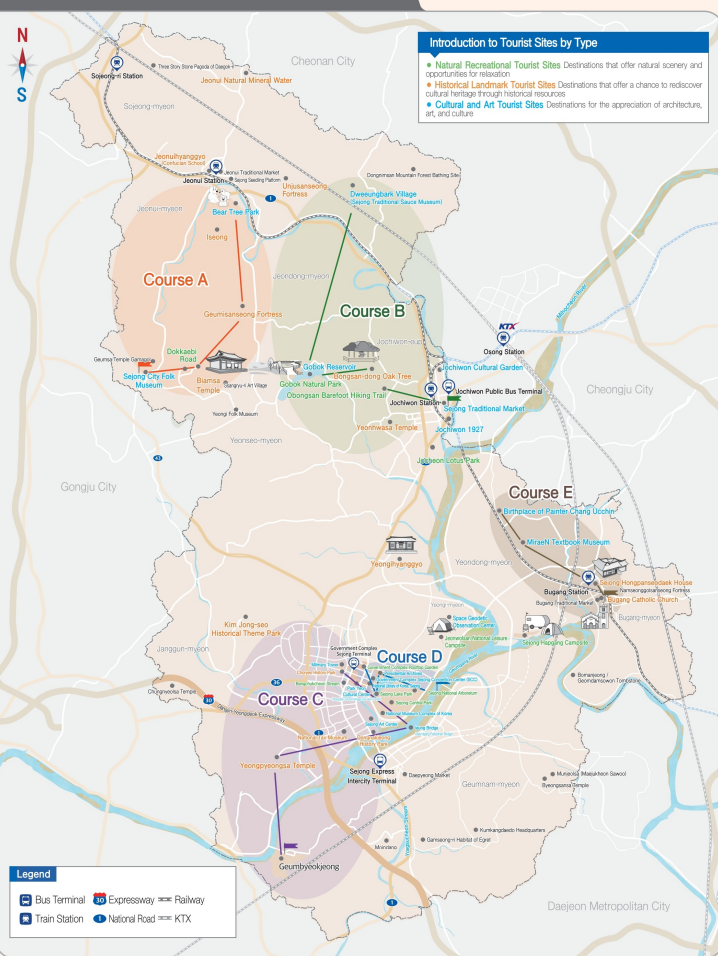

Iseong

This mountain fortress, called Iseong, surrounds the summit and spans about 790 meters in circumference. It was named after Lee Jo, who built and lived in the fortress during the reign of King Taejo of Goryeo. The fortress was originally constructed as a frontier with early Unified Silla modifications, the fortress was constructed using the rugged mountain terrain to strengthen its defense, earning it the nickname "iron fortress." It remains a popular destination for middle and high school field trips and is recognized as an important historical site.

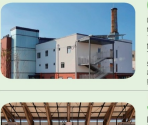

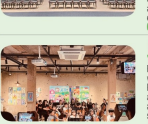

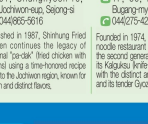
Cheongjaeang Multicultural Space

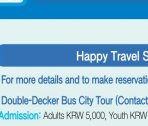
Jochiwon 1927 Art Center

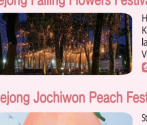


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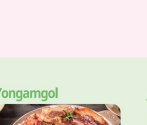
Sejong Seasonal Festivals

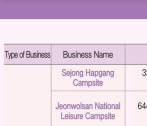
Sejong Jochiwon Peach Festival (July-August)

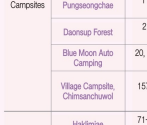
Sejong Festival (October)
